"As a Canadian woman and as a member of the Catholic Women's League of Canada, I support the Nordic Model which recognizes that the root cause of the exploitation of women through prostitution is the demand of male customers, without which the global industry of trafficking and prostitution would collapse. This model would criminalize the pimps and johns but not the prostitutes themselves, who are the victims of exploitation and are in need of exit strategies to regain control of their lives."
- 4. Please remember you are responding on an individual basis, NOT on behalf of the League. Our National President, Betty Anne Brown Davidson is the ONLY person who speaks on behalf of the League.
