Our new theme, "Care for Our Common Home", leads us to have respect for our planet, sharing of human resources, for the homeless and the destitute, the hungry and all who bear the brunt of indifference and oppression.

There are all kinds of ways to learn more about Catholic Teachings, wonderful books to read, or follow Pope Francis on Twitter. Pope Francis urges us to open ourselves to Jesus, like the Magi, rather than being afraid of losing our status and power, like Herod.

The "Role of Women in the Church and Lay Ministries" is huge, we are right there in every part of our church. We are Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors, Servers, Collectors, Children Liturgy Teachers and Sacristans.

- February 8th, the feast day of St Josephine Margaret Bakhita, FDCC, is an annual day of prayer and awareness against human trafficking.
- World Day of the Sick ~ February 11th reminds us that service to the sick and suffering cannot be neglected. It recognizes the great efforts of doctors, nurses, health care institutions and pastoral care givers, to restore health to those afflicted with illness and disease.
- World Day of Prayer ~ Friday, March 1st: This program was written by women in Slovenia, one of the smallest countries in Europe and a relatively young committee, in the WDP movement. This year's theme is: Come – Everything is Ready!, based on Luke 14.15-24.
