Catholic Education

In August 2019, a revised Health and Physical Education Curriculum was released. This revised curriculum includes much of the content first introduced in 2015. The curriculum continues to address a number of important topics including mental health, online safety and the risks of sexting, respect for self and consent within healthy relationships. The revised curriculum is being implemented in the 2019-2020 school year. I think it is important for us to be aware of the terms and concepts that our Catholic teachers are hoping to teach our young students. Environment

I hope by now you are doing your personal best to reduce the use of plastics. Let's make commitments to support and praise businesses that promote reusable bags, produce bags etc. Communicate with elected officials that you are willing to work with them to make our environment more sustainable. Get involved with local groups who have a sustainability mandate. Invite a speaker on 'Recycling' to one of your meetings. Consider a sewing circle to make your own produce bags.

Wellness and sickness/disease

Does your parish have a Pastoral Care Team? Do your members visit the sick and homebound? Is there a ride-sharing activity among your members to assist people who need transportation to come to Mass? In times of illness, disability, parishioners *need* the reception of the Eucharist, the recitation of prayers and the participation in spiritual traditions- let's find ways to include them in parish life. Many of these activities address our provincial theme of loneliness too.

Lastly, regarding Resolutions: Karen McDonald, provincial Education and Health Committee Chairperson reminds us of **three resolutions relating to** *Education and Health that* were passed at the 2019 provincial convention. Members are asked to read them and follow up on the Action Plans. Why not host a letter-writing activity at one of your meetings and address your personal concerns to elected officials?
