# Wellness/ Sickness (1) URGENT REQUEST - CUTS TO MEDICAL COMPENSATION

The Ontario Medical Association has released a bulletin indicating that "since March, the Ontario government's focus has been entirely on pandemic management and that's good. Now though they need to broaden that perspective to the rest of the healthcare system...(our system) relies entirely on physician offices staying open. This is **now at risk**. (2) Euthanasia Prevention Coalition invites us to sign a petition against Bill C-7 which would give Canada the most permissive MAiD (medical assistance in dying) regime in the world. Here's a guick summary of the consequences if Bill C-7 passes in its current form:

- Euthanasia can be allowed by advanced request. This means that incompetent people who have previously been approved for euthanasia will be lethally injected.
- The ten-day waiting period will be waived for those deemed "terminally • **ill**". This would mean that someone could request euthanasia on a bad day and can die from lethal injection that same day. Studies have shown that the "will to live" fluctuates over time.

 No requirement that someone's death must be "reasonably foreseeable" to be euthanized. Because MAiD is permitted for "physical or psychological suffering that is intolerable to them and that cannot be relieved under conditions that they consider acceptable", Bill C-7 will not prevent MAiD for those with mental illnesses (because mental illness has no legal definition and causes psychological suffering)

Sign the petition to warn David Lametti, the Minister of Justice, and Patty Hadju, The Minister of Health, that Bill C-7 is dangerous and is the wrong approach to treating vulnerable Canadians, and that it is not what is best for Canada.

### **Catholic Education**

The theme of 2020's Catholic Education Week (was May 4-8) was '**Igniting Hope'**. Our children and youth are seeds in the Father's garden, eager to grow and develop to their full potential. Together with parents and the parish, our Catholic teachers need our prayers and support to fulfill their role in making the path of salvation known to their students. These include titles of: *Ordinary Mary's Extraordinary Deed, Ada's Violin, Saint Brother Andre, Emeline the Cat, Imagine a World, and others...* all with a theme of 'hope'. Might your Council co-ordinate with the school to see if you could provide copies of some of these titles to their library?

The scripture quote above also makes us consider another aspect of our parish life of our youth. I encourage your Councils to pray for your parish Confirmandi of grades 7/8 who may have their Sacrament of Confirmation postponed to the fall or later. Perhaps members could create cards or letters of support to these youth (with permission from your pastor and the school administration) and send them to the school for distribution.
