1. Annunciation (for the love of humility)
2. Visitation (for charity towards my neighbour)
3. Birth of Jesus (for the spirit of poverty)
4. Presentation (for the virtue of obedience)
5. Finding of Child Jesus in the Temple (for the virtue of piety)

The Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesday & Friday)

1. Agony in the Garden (for true contrition for sin)
2. Scourging at the Pillar (for the virtue of purity)
3. Crowning with Thorns (for moral courage)
4. Carrying of the Cross (for the virtue of patience)
5. Crucifixion (for final perseverance)

The Glorious Mysteries (Wednesday & Sunday)

1. Resurrection (for the virtue of faith)
2. Ascension (for the virtue of hope)
3. Descent of the Holy Spirit (for the virtue of love)
4. Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (for a happy death)
5. Coronation of the Blessed Virgin Mary (for eternal salvation)

The Luminous Mysteries (Thursday)

1. Baptism of Jesus (for submission to God's will)
2. Wedding Feast at Cana (for devotion to Mary)
3. Proclamation of the Kingdom of God (for the grace of conversion)
4. Transfiguration (for holy fear of God)
5. Institution of the Holy Eucharist (for thanksgiving to God)

Jesus, I trust in You.

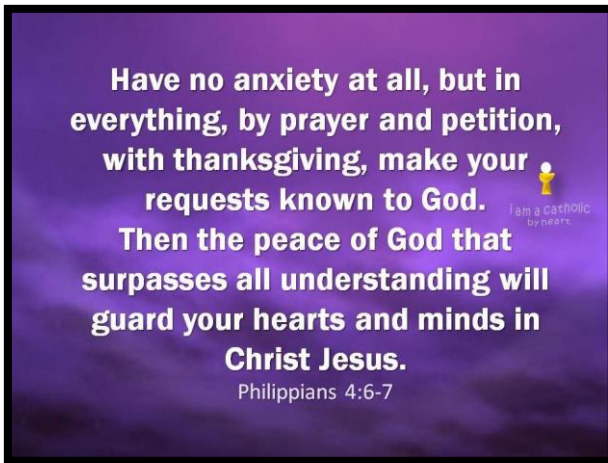
