

Peace be with you my dear Sisters in the League!

As I write this, the month of prayer for the souls in Purgatory has begun in earnest, and this week, the Church has given us all week an opportunity to meditate on saint Paul's letter to the Philippians, a letter from which "Rejoice in the Lord always!", the focus of our recently installed provincial president, Colleen Martin, is inspired (her provincial focus is a quote from the letter of saint Paul to the Philippians, chapter 4, verse 4).

In short, I am excited and feeling inspired as I sit down to invite you to the 2025 Diocesan Convention of the Catholic Women's League for the Archdiocese of Kingston (April 26-27, 2025). For her part, our Diocesan President Maureen Vincentine has invited you to focus on mentoring in your local experience of walking with your sisters in your local parish councils. Meanwhile, the National theme of the Catholic Women's League "Here I am Lord, send me!" continues to accompany us till the August National Convention in 2025.

The Diocesan Convention is happening throughout the weekend known as *Divine Mercy Sunday*. This is a providential message. WE HEARD YOU

As we sifted through the feedback from last year's evaluation forms, the sense was that of satisfaction. You appreciated the spiritual inspiration, how well it was organized, the fellowship opportunities, the guest speakers, the friendliness of both the hotel staff and our CWL hostesses as well as the venue itself. There were a few negative comments on the food quality but for the most part, the meals were enjoyed.

The overall consensus however was the meal prices were way too high so let me speak a little on that and what we are working on...

- ✓ The cost of food and services have risen everywhere. It is not specific to the Quality Inn. Their prices are comparable to other venues in the area.
- ✓ The prices must include tax (13%) and administrative / service charge (18%). An example of what that looks like: when the buffet evening dinner is listed as \$45.00 in their brochure, we are actually being charged \$59.85 by the hotel. The host council sets the price per meal based on the hotel actual cost and their budget. Saturday night buffet was listed as \$60.00.
- ✓ Another popular question is why can't we have a cookie or muffin with break? Serving coffee / tea only is listed as \$5.00, with the actual cost being \$6.65 per person. You will remember you were charged \$3.00 with the host council making up the difference. Adding food packages would come at an actual cost ranging from \$17 to \$26 a person.
 - We did get permission from the hotel to include a pre-packaged bar or cookie in the delegate bags for you to enjoy. Note: outside food is not allowed in the meeting rooms without prior permission from the hotel.

Going Forward

Regardless of all the rising price explanations, it doesn't change the fact that many of our members cannot afford to pay the price of these meals. We sat down with the hotel and explained our situation. We were simply being outpriced of hosting our convention in any hotel environment and we likely would be looking at other options such as using church or school facilities in the future.

The Quality Inn Hotel and Conference Centre in Kingston does not want to lose our yearly visit and has provided us some options and discounts where the food is concerned, while still remaining viable (they are a business!).

- 1. They have lowered the coffee/tea break from \$5.00 to \$2.50. (actual cost now \$3.33). With some sponsors and fundraising, your Diocesan Council feels we could cover this cost and provide it to you free. We still need to know if you will be partaking for planning purposes.
- 2. The hotel has introduced their Budget Buffet ranging from \$20 to \$28 (before tax and service). This is cheaper than previous years however there is a catch: Minimum 80 people. Under 80 people add \$10 per person. We have chosen both Saturday meals from this section so we ask you to please consider joining us for both lunch and dinner. We will need to pay for at least 80 meals or eat the extra cost.
- 3. They lowered the basic cost for the banquet plated meal by charging additional for premium dishes. You will have 3 selections to choose from and your cost will be \$9 less than last year.

In addition, the guest room rate remains unchanged from last year at \$159 plus tax and service.

The hotel management is truly trying to work with us to assist our guests in these troubled economic times. We hope these adjustments will help you to participate in all aspects of the weekend.

PROVINCIAL VOLUNTARY FUND

Bishop Bernard F. Pappin Memorial Bursary Fund

Bishop Pappin was the Provincial Spiritual Advisor and died suddenly while in office. The Provincial Executive established this fund in his memory, and it is used annually to financially assist seminarians in Ontario.

DIOCESAN VOLUNTARY FUND

HOPE Fund

This unique diocesan project was the inspiration of Theresa Mangan, and Lillian O'Connor with encouragement from Father Boyle, then Diocesan Spiritual Advisor, with input from Carmel Foster. It was established as a project of love and concern for our neighbour.

The Hope Fund has tended to give consideration to applications that relate to family or individual situations. However, non-funded groups that are struggling to provide a better community environment are not necessarily prohibited from receiving a 'ray of hope.'

Parish councils are encouraged to make an annual donation to the Hope Fund and to submit the name of potential recipients along with a brief summary of the reason for submitting the name(s). The application form should be returned to the diocesan president as per the instructions on the bottom of the form.

Kenya Help

Kenya Help was founded in 2008 by Nancy Stevens. However, the seeds for its creation were sown during Nancy's first trip to Africa in 2005, working as a Habitat for Humanity volunteer. She then volunteered in several other African countries before making Kenya her home away from home. The knowledge Nancy gained working on these various projects created a vision of "doing things differently" to continue her mission of changing the lives of others in Africa. Working with the community leaders and elders has been her focus; to work together for the same goals. Kenya Help encourages self-sustainability, builds schools, and provides food and clean drinking water.

Their mission is to make positive change for the children of Ngong, Kenya. They work to enhance the education of students by providing full classrooms, food and clean water. They provide the tools in order for the communities to become more self-sustainable and be able to lift themselves from poverty. Education is empowering the children and communities and gives them the courage to better their lives. Their vision is to see the next generation of leaders grow physically strong, spiritually generous, technically knowledgeable and ready to change the work.

Four agencies and the CWL national bursary fund are permanently assisted by donations received from members and councils of The Catholic Women's League of Canada.

- Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace (CCODP) established in 1967, is Canada's official Catholic overseas development organization launched by the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops. CCODP has helped support projects such as grassroots community development, literacy programs, mother and child health care, skills training, agricultural programs and emergency relief. CCODP also supports educational programs, helping make Canadians more aware of the problems and goals of people in developing countries. CCODP's primary sources of funds are the yearly Share Lent campaign, Canadian International Development Agency and donations from individuals and groups. Since 1969, the League has supported women's projects in developing countries funded by CCODP through the "1% Program." Brochures are available from national office.
- Catholic Missions In Canada (CMIC) CWL Mission Partners Fund raises funds to provide missionaries with the tools they need to catechize throughout mission dioceses found within Canada. CWL Mission Partners, in conjunction with the League, supports six religious education programs.
- Catholic Near East Welfare Association (CNEWA) raises funds to support Eastern Catholic churches by building up the church, affirming human dignity and alleviating poverty, encouraging dialogue and inspiring hope.
- Coady International Institute of St. Francis Xavier University, Antigonish, Nova Scotia, was founded by Dr. Moses Coady who gave leadership to the Antigonish Movement, which promotes the ideal that by learning and working together, men and women become "masters of their own destinies."
- National Bursary Fund In 1988, the League received two generous donations in response to the call for lay formation in Pope John Paul II's Exhortation, Christifideles Laici. In light of the expressed desire of the League to encourage members' service "For God and Canada", the national executive agreed by motion that these donations be used to establish a bursary fund. The bursary fund is used to provide financial assistance to members needing it to pursue studies, courses, seminars, conferences, workshops and diploma/degree programs in areas of spiritual growth, adult faith formation, and youth ministry, ministry to patients in palliative care, ministry to shut-ins, parliamentary procedure, and literacy tutoring.
